



Paper Flower Crown

Recommended for Ages 7 - 10

Get ready for spring and create a paper flower crown!

You will need the following materials:

- Scissors
- Ruler
- Pencil
- String or yarn
- Single hole punch
- Regular glue or hot glue gun
- Any of the following: colored construction paper, scrapbooking paper, plain white paper
- Markers, crayons, colored pencils, colored pens
- Tissue paper (optional)

Instructions:

- 1. Take one full sheet of construction paper and cut a 2-inch-wide strip along the long side of the paper, and then set it aside.
- 2. Look through the rest of the paper you've gathered and select your color scheme. If you don't have colored paper use some plain white paper.
- 3. Use the template provided as a guide for your flowers to trace or draw the flowers on the paper.
- 4. If you decided to use plain white paper then you can use markers, crayons, colored pencils to decorate the flower templates before cutting them.
- 5. You can layer the flowers on top of each other with glue from largest to smallest, and even curl the edges if you want for a 3-D effect. If you have tissue paper, you can crumble up small pieces that can be glued to the center of your flower. Set aside flowers to let the glue dry.



- 6. When you are ready to assemble your paper flower crown grab the 2-inch-wide strip of paper you cut at the beginning of the project and attach the flowers you made to it using glue. Set aside and let dry.
- 7. Use your hole punch to make at hole at each end of the strip.
- 8. Thread some yarn or string through the holes and measure your head and then tie it off with a knot.
